

ICD Shock and Lead Failure Case Reports

Implantable cardioverter defibrillators (ICDs) are life-saving devices used for the prevention and treatment of life-threatening ventricular arrhythmias and sudden cardiac death. However, clinically significant complications such as **inappropriate shocks, lead fracture, lead dislodgement, oversensing, and device malfunction** can occur and require urgent evaluation. **Case Reports and Case Series in Cardiology Journal** welcomes submissions of **ICD shock and lead failure case reports and case series** that highlight rare clinical scenarios, device complications, emergency management, and long-term outcomes.

This dedicated section focuses on clinically important reports involving **inappropriate ICD shocks, ventricular lead fracture, shock coil failure, sensing abnormalities, and early post-implantation complications**. Recent case reports have documented **very early lead fracture within days of implantation** and **multiple inappropriate shocks due to lead malfunction**, emphasizing the educational value of such cases.
